



# First Word

FEBRUARY 2012

February is one of my favorite months because of the number of holidays that fall in this special month. We begin the month with Groundhog Day that seems to come repeatedly. This unsung holiday, celebrated on February 2nd, gives us an opportunity to predict a little of the future. Next on February 14th, we celebrate St. Valentine's Day and remember that he gave his life for his faith and lived his life sharing Christian love. In fact, the Nuremberg Chronicles claim that Claudius II martyred Valentine because he was performing Christian marriages against the edict of Rome. Then, on February 20th, we celebrate the birthdays of two of our greatest presidents, George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Finally, as a country, throughout the month of February, we celebrate the tremendous contributions of African Americans to our culture.

This past month I have been reading about George Washington and have learned a great deal about the man whose birth we celebrate this month. I learned that he was disciplined, that he was a man of character and that he made his fair share of mistakes. Most importantly, I learned that when it comes to integrity there is no man who had greater character than our first president. As I researched the life of Washington, I was surprised to learn that there was one event, seldom told in history lessons that challenged Washington's integrity and character more than any other. This event in Washington's life tested him as the future of America hung in the balance.

On March 15, 1783, after Washington had formed and led the continental army in its fight for liberty, after he had survived the bleak 1778 winter at Valley Forge, and routed the British at Yorktown and Trenton, Washington was forced to face his own officers as they proposed open rebellion. On March 15, 1783, in the Temple of Honor at Newburg, New York, General Washington spoke to his officers who were planning to march on Philadelphia in order to remove the congress from power. This conspiracy was hatched because the congress had failed to pay the army and the soldiers felt it was time they were paid. Had this insurrection succeeded, the experiment in liberty and democracy in America would have ended in its infancy.

Faced with such a challenge, Washington marched into the fray and stood alone amongst the men with whom he had served. He was a man of principle and he would not back down. He stood his ground, made a rousing speech and the men in the room were swayed to tears. With his integrity, passion and character General George Washington was able to save the republic. One man stood tall with conviction and changed history.

This month we celebrate George's birth, but more importantly, this month we live with the liberty, freedom and rights defended by his conviction and passion. As Christians, we should take note. We are called to be people of conviction, character and integrity. Anything else is hypocrisy when it comes to our faith. It is my prayer that each of us develops the kind of character and integrity demonstrated by our first president. It is also my prayer that each of us knows that one person's character and passion for their beliefs can change the world.

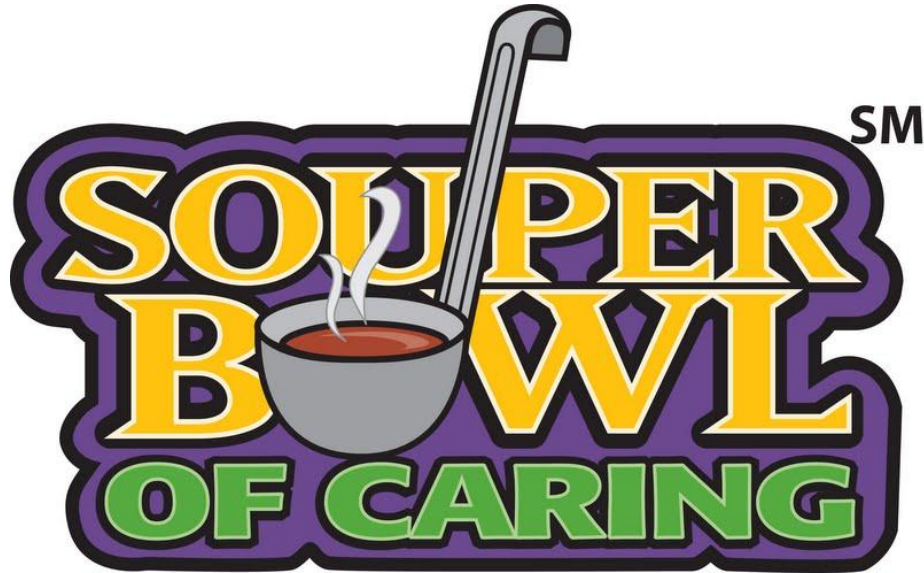

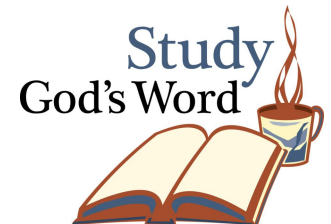

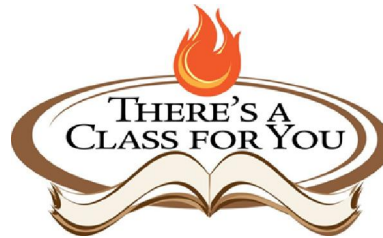
### **Sunday Mornings at 9:45 a.m.**

# Calvin Crest Summer Camps

\*Transportation costs are determined by the number of individuals attending camp. Transportation fees will be calculated and published after the registration deadline.

**FPC supports all ministries of Calvin Crest camps and conferences, but will only coordinate registration; recruit and train counselors; and provide transportation for the camp dates listed above.** Campers attending these camps are eligible for FPC scholarship funds and may apply C.A.S.H. funds to the registration fee and/or transportation costs\*.

Registration forms along with details pertaining to registration procedures, payment deadlines, scholarships, C.A.S.H. funds and transportation information for the FPCVegas camp dates have been mailed out. Additional registration packets are available from the church office and at the Calvin Crest Night on February 10, 2011. **All forms and payments for these camps are to be submitted to FPC (NOT Calvin Crest). The DEADLINE to register to attend camp with FPCVegas is Sunday, February 26, 2012.**

Those who choose to attend other Calvin Crest camps must register independently with Calvin Crest and will be considered on an individual basis for FPC Scholarship and C.A.S.H. funds only after those attending FPCVegas camp dates. Transportation will not be provided for any camps other than the FPCVegas dates.

### Calvin Crest Family Camp

Calvin Crest also offers two weeks of Family Camp at the beginning of the summer. Many FPC families will attend *Family Camp 3*, July 1 ó 7, 2012. FPCVegas recommends Family Camp to any family who is looking for a Christ-Centered summer camp experience for the entire family. 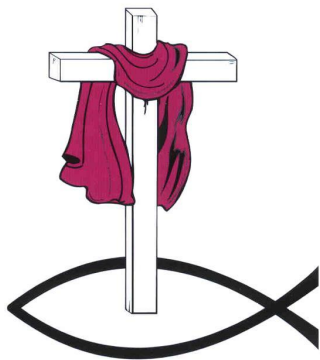
## Valentine Candy Factory

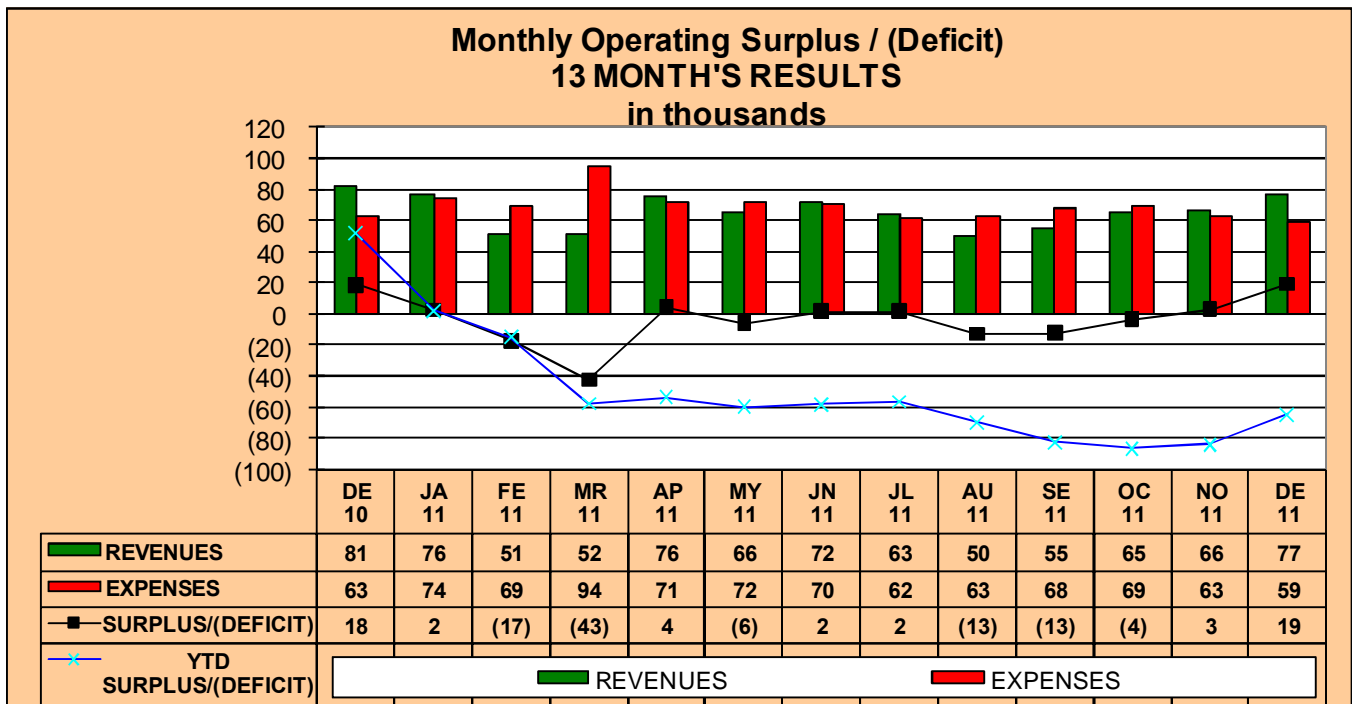

## Some Highlights in Black History

Have you ever wondered how the month of February, became Black History Month? The month of February was not chosen because it is the shortest month of the year, as some people thought. It begins with Frederick Douglas, a black man. A slave, born in 1817, a person that wanted to change customs, laws and practices that did not apply for all people, so he did. In the year of 1838 Frederick Douglas escaped from slavery and started working for a Publishing Company. Like most people born into slavery, Frederick Douglas never knew his birthday, so he invented a birthday for himself. Because he knew he had been born in the teens, he chose 1817 as his birth year. And because he remembered that his mother called him her "Little Valentine" he chose February 14th as his birth date. Later, Dr. Carter G. Woodson, an educator and a black man, chose the second week of February to give honor to Frederick Douglas.

In 1926, Dr. Carter G. Woodson was the founding father of our "Negro History Week". Since 1926, the celebration has gone through some name changes. For example:

In 1926 - Negro History Week  
In 1970 - Afro-American History Month  
Today - Black History Month

The real reason for "Black History Month" is to recognize achievements and contributions by Black Americans since February 1926. Like other races they have their own celebration during the year.

Dr. Woodson chose the second week of February for "Negro History Week" because it marks the birthdays of two men who greatly influenced the Black Americans population, Frederick Douglas and Abraham Lincoln.

February 23, 1868:

W.E.B. Dubois, Important Civil Rights Leader and co-founder of the NAACP.

First black to earn a PhD degree.

February 3, 1870:

The 15th Amendment was passed granting blacks the right to vote.

February 25, 1870:

The First Black U.S. Senator, Hiram R. Revels (1822-1900) took the oath of office.



## Some Highlights in Black History (cont.)

February 1, 1900:

In what would become a Civil Rights Movement milestone, a group of black Greensboro, N.C. college students began a sit-in at a segregated Woolworth's lunch counter.

February 12, 1909:

The National Association For The Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) was founded by a group of concerned black and white citizens in New York City.

January 20, 2009:

Barack Obama became the First African-American President of these United States. Change has come to America, can you handle this change? Yes. We. Can.
